**How to take action and call

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Discerning a Prophetic Word

You receive a prophetic word, and most of the time, it should be a confirmation of something you already know. Your prophetic word should have the “up factor.”

It should build up, train up, encourage up and edify up. It should leave you hopeful for something that is coming to pass in the future.

What happens when it doesn't do the thing it is intended? What do you do with a prophetic word that doesn't make sense? There are choices to make when a prophetic word doesn't make sense.

- We can throw it out because it is in no way witnessing with our soul and spirit, and we think the person who delivered it is way off in left field.
- We can pray into it and see if the Holy Spirit confirms the word to us.
- We can shelve it. We can put it up on the shelf and see if the Holy Spirit ever brings

it down or if a situation happens and all of a sudden we remember this word we put on the shelf because we were unsure if it was for us.

Occasionally, when we receive a prophetic word, we can be unsure and unsettled if the word was for us. We can react in different ways to the prophetic word that was spoken in our lives. We can become caught up in attempting to discern the word or we can dismiss the word altogether. Both options can have adverse effects on us.

When we receive a prophetic word, it should witness to us. There should be some kind of affirmation within us that it is a word from the Lord. When a word is from the Lord and resonates within us, we should pray into it, cover it with the blood of Christ and call it forth according to the word of God and will of God in prayer and declarations.

When a prophetic word is not witnessing to us at that moment, we should shelve it. What I mean is just that: put it up on the shelf in the spiritual realm or in your mind. Don't let it consume you and don't try to figure it out. Take the word and put it in your memory bank and then move on.

Keep doing what you are doing for that season. When and if the word is for you God will bring it back to remembrance, confirm it in His Word, the Bible, or bring another person to prophesy a similar word to confirm it to you.

There was a time I received a very long prophetic word from a well-known prophet. Part of the prophetic word was, “My daughter, you have a desire for prayer. Lord, I feel like the church has forgotten about prayer. I wish someone would reinstitute prayer in the house. Guess who I am going to use? I’m going to use you to rally men and women to seek me, seek me, seek me, as they never have before. Find yourself in at least one 24-hour vigil.”

As I received this word, I thought, “I don’t feel that way, and I have been in charge of several 72-hour prayer vigils.” As I dissected the prophetic word given to me that night, I put this part of the word up on the shelf because it didn’t make sense to me; I thought it was off and not for me. I did not throw it away. I put it in my memory bank.

A year later, I found myself teaching people around me how to pray differently, but I still did not realize that this word was manifesting in my life. One day as I was writing one of my books,

the Holy Spirit shot through me. I was sitting at my desk typing, and I was allowing the Holy Spirit to move through me to write.

I started writing about prayer and thinking that people don't know how to pray. That is when I felt the Holy Spirit come upon me. It felt like a bolt of lightning shot through my body. I looked up and, in the spiritual realm, I saw the shelf and the prophetic word. I had misinterpreted the word. I was looking at the church as a building when the church is the people.

The church is the body of Christ and that prophetic word was right! I had been complaining for months that people didn't know how to pray effectively. I took what I was seeing and hearing and started teaching people how to really pray!

The word was for me all along, but I didn't recognize it. How many words are people waiting for that they think are not coming to pass because they totally dismissed them or did not recognize them? We need to be open to how the Holy Spirit wants to move through us. We need to make sure in our pride or arrogance that we are not dismissing a word or assuming it's not for us.

The most important thing is keeping our minds and will open to the Holy Spirit, so that

in that moment He desires to remind us of a word from long ago, we understand and hear His voice. Even though I dissected the prophetic word, I still did not get the full meaning out of it. I should have looked further into every word, but that's okay because now I can use it as a testimony to you.

Stay open to the Spirit. Don't totally dismiss what you don't understand. Dissect your prophetic words (learn more about dissecting

your prophecies through my Prophetic Course at charismacourses.com), and most of all don't give up in the waiting. Who knows? Perhaps the Holy Spirit will get hold of you like He did me, and pretty soon you will see things manifesting in your life that were spoken long ago.

Be encouraged. God has a plan for you. Be diligent! Seek His presence and His word! Worship Him in freedom and truth and discover how the kingdom of God will manifest in your life and use you to display His kingdom to others!

Commanding Your Words to Manifest

Three years ago, I had most of my prophetic words come to pass. I prayed and sought the Lord and asked Him to release more prophetic words into my life so I could expand His kingdom further and glorify the name of Jesus in a more significant way.

In the Bible, it says, “For we know in part, and we prophesy in part” (1 Cor. 13:9). Prophecy is in part. The first part is delivered by the prophetic person releasing the word. The second part is us co-laboring with the Holy Spirit through prayer to receive an understanding of the word and to command it to manifest in the natural.

If we receive a prophetic word that we are going to come into wealth, we can't simply sit around and wait for a million dollars to drop in our living room or someone to write us a big check. We need to seek the Holy Spirit in prayer and ask for creative ideas, business strategies and

things to invent. Our wealth is often going to come by us seeking the Lord for instructions on how to receive the financial blessing He desires us to have.

Warfare starts when the prophetic word is spoken. It has just been released into the spiritual atmosphere, and the adversary and his cohorts

will try and wage war against the prophetic word released in your life. Therefore, we need to decree and declare against the warfare and take authority over attacks against the word coming forth. We must take the word by force! “The kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and the violent take it by force” (Matt. 11:12b, NKJV). The Modern English Version says, “The kingdom of heaven has forcefully advanced, and the strong take it by force.” We have to be strong and take what we desire by force, through prayer, declarations and our authority in Jesus Christ.

Jesus and the Father both took authority over things and spoke to create (see my book, *Speak Out*). We need to pray audibly and speak out

words into existence. Jesus gave us authority, and we need to take that authority by praying audibly and speaking forth our prophetic words to manifestation. We can't sit idly by and expect them to manifest supernaturally, although I do believe that can happen.

Manifesting Your Prophetic Words

I manifested my prophetic words by keeping them in front of me and putting a demand on them.

- Type up your prophetic words. Visit them regularly or as the Holy Spirit leads.
- Attach a written declaration to each line. Take the prophetic word and for each segment write a two or three-line declaration calling it forth. Be specific! If you have a prophecy that a worship leader is coming to your church, do you want a worship leader or do you want a Spirit-filled, anointed worship leader, who will be on time, lead with excellence and exude love?
- Decree and declare over your words out loud.
- Bind and restrict the enemy from coming to steal, kill and destroy (John 10:10).

Knowing your authority in Christ and praying audibly are instrumental in manifesting your prophetic words. You can learn more about authority and your identity in my course, “Purpose and Destiny,” at charismacourses.com.

The Holy Spirit doesn't use people to release prophetic words to us to not have them come to pass. He doesn't desire to give us false hope. He doesn't want us discouraged. He gives us those words to keep us in a place of perseverance and determination while waiting for the words to manifest. I believe many prophetic words are sitting idle because the body of Christ is stagnant in calling them forth. We have a part to play in manifesting our prophetic words. The world needs your prophecies to manifest, so the ministry the Lord is calling you to is to go forth. We need all of our prophecies manifesting together to reach this world for Jesus Christ. Get up! Get active! Call those words forth!

Testing Your Prophetic Word

You just received a prophetic word and believe it is from the Lord. Your concern is: “What do I do next?” My concern is what you didn’t do next.

The next step is not taking action on the prophetic word you received, but testing it. Ask yourself questions such as, “Will this bear fruit and glorify the name of Jesus Christ, or will it distract and detour me from my godly assignment?” Prophecy is in part, and your first responsibility is to discern the accuracy of the prophetic word delivered.

When receiving a prophetic word that you believe is from the Lord, you should stop and verify it is truly from the Lord and not your flesh desiring it or the enemy trying to distract you. Our own desires can seduce us into thinking something is of the Lord when it is not. It is wisdom to verify the word (not analyze it) before

you take action. Taking the word at face value without seeking confirmation and direction can detour you from the will of God.

We can prematurely act on a word because we feel it makes sense and we have comfort proceeding. We think, *I can do this*. We are comfortable because it makes sense to us in the natural, but the question is: Do we have peace proceeding forth in the spiritual?

We are not natural people; we are spiritual beings. Moving forward with a prophetic word because of our natural comfort is one of the main ways the enemy and our flesh can cause us to proceed in a wrong direction. It must be tested.

When you receive revelation, a prophetic word or an answer to prayer, take the next step. Discern it. Dissect it. Don't overthink and don't analyze. Test it. Bring it back to the Holy Spirit through prayer and test it against the Word of God and what you currently know to be the will of God for your life.

God Downloads

God speaks to us through thoughts dropped in our spirit. When God speaks to us, we need not try to figure out the revelation, but instead receive

the revelation He is giving.

You may have heard God's voice before saying, "Don't do that," "Take this road instead today" or "Give this much as an offering." You have heard God as you have prayed and felt you received your answer. However, don't just feel you have received the answer. Instead, know you have received the response.

When you receive discernment, ask yourself, *Is this the way God usually speaks to me?* Verify it. He may speak to you in different ways, but it should witness in your spirit. Ask God, "Why do you want me to head in this direction?"

Test the Scriptures to confirm if the prophetic word and revelation you are receiving aligns with or contradicts God's Word. God will not tell you to do something that is against His Word. I once knew a woman God had been convicting regarding giving. She felt led to write an offering check for \$5,000. She wrote the check in advance of a business transaction that was being completed. The deal fell through, and she ended up in debt! That contradicts God's Word. If she would have tested the discernment, she would have stayed out of debt.

Flesh Blocks Revelation

Our flesh gets involved in receiving revelation because we think about it instead of praying about it. When thinking about whether a prophetic word is from God, we tend to overanalyze it and get impatient waiting on God for an answer.

Analytical people can plan out the answer instead of praying and receiving the answer. During prayer time, analytical people have difficulty shutting down their minds to receive from

God. When analytical thoughts come into your mind, transfer those thoughts to your heart, to the place of love, where the Father is. He will help you accurately discern the word.

When you receive the revelation from a prophetic word, ask yourself, “Is this the way I would think?” You may think you heard from God when really what you heard were your own thoughts. Try to distinguish the difference between hearing God’s voice and hearing your own.

Deceptions and Distractions

If confusion is present in times of discernment, it is from the enemy. “For God is not the author of confusion, but of peace” (1 Cor. 14:33).

The enemy will attempt to distract. When we don't pray about things in advance, it leaves the enemy an open door to sidetrack us.

Testing the Spirits

When testing the spirits, ask yourself if you are feeling convicted. Conviction from the Holy Spirit is quick and calls you to action. He presses you until you act. When a prophetic word is received from the Lord, it puts a prophetic burden within our spirit to complete God's will for our lives. It calls us to action with a holy reverential fear of the Lord to complete the burden He has placed within us.

Testing the word is important to verify it is of the Lord. Processing the information until you know the authenticity of the word. As spiritual warfare occurs, you cannot automatically assume that you can hear God with the same clarity as in other times. All of us have heard wrong at one time or another, and have regretted the decisions we made in the flesh. Therefore, making sure we have valid marching orders from the Spirit of the

Lord is essential before we proceed.

In 1 John 4:1, the Word of God instructs us to test the spirits.

When you receive revelation from God, keep it in front of you and consistently pray it through.

Ask for His will to be further revealed and for Him to give you the spirit of revelation, knowledge, wisdom and understanding (Isa. 11:2).

Be in tune and sensitive to the Holy Spirit's leading and then be obedient. Persevere and accomplish His will for your life.

Actions Lead to Manifestation

Prophetic words are sought after more than healing or deliverance. We all want to hear from our heavenly Father. We desire to know His plans, purposes and instructions for our lives. We do hear from God. It really is easy. I believe many people don't realize how easy it is. That's why I published *Who is Speaking?—Discerning the Source Infiltrating Your Thoughts*.

However, since we don't realize how easy it is to hear from the Lord, we often seek out prophets for a word from the Lord. But it doesn't stop there. We get one word, and then we want another and another. We are consistently seeking the prophetic to have the Lord continually give us another word when the first, second or even third words haven't manifested.

Should we seek another word from the Lord when we have so many unfilled words of the Lord?

Prophecy is in part. The prophet's

responsibility is to deliver the word. Our job is to then co-labor with the Holy Spirit in the manifestation of that word. Christians have been discouraged and frustrated while they have waited for the manifestation of their prophetic words. Some have given up on their faith because the word of the Lord didn't come to pass.

Prophecy has an action that we have to take in order to see the fulfillment of that word come to pass. Our part in our word is to research it, discern it and ask the Holy Spirit for instructions on how we are to co-labor with Him to bring it to pass. What character developments do we need to work on in the process? Where do we need to study and grow? Is part of your word about financial increase? Then ask the Holy Spirit for entrepreneurial ideas. Ask Him what you need to do.

We go about seeking a prophet and wanting and desiring yet another prophetic word when we haven't done anything to try to bring our first words to pass. Why should the Spirit of the Lord keep piling up more and more words when we haven't done what He first instructed? Prophetic words are encouragements and signposts that lead us to a direction.

Prophetic words should lead us into a seeking

time with our heavenly Father. They should draw us to press into Him and discover our role in manifesting the word so that the kingdom can manifest on earth. Ask yourself, “What am I doing to take responsibility for the word that has been delivered to me? Why am I seeking another word when I haven’t co-labored with the first word?”

We have a responsibility to take in the manifestation of our words. We need to diagram and

assess that word to make sure it is truly of the Spirit of the Lord. After we distinguish what is of the Lord, we can add a Scripture to that word. Solidifying our words in Scripture is powerful! I then suggest writing a declaration for each line of the prophetic word (see my book *Speak Out* on writing prophetic declarations). Turn each sentence into a prayer declaration. Praying and asking the Holy Spirit for divine wisdom and revelation regarding your word is instrumental in pulling down this word from heaven to the manifestation here on earth.

God has great plans for you! What are you going to do to manifest them? We can't sit around waiting for our prophecies to come to pass. We have to co-labor with the very Spirit of God who gave them to us.

Overcoming Spiritual Attacks Against Your Words

Prophetic declarations will bring forth both results and warfare, but there is a positive aspect in knowing how to declare. When you know how to declare, you can decree against the warfare that will attempt to attack your situation.

Why do you think people don't see the manifestation of their prophetic words? Because spiritual warfare is released when the word is spoken, and we are not interceding against the warfare. We must learn how to war, fight and declare through prayer against the spiritual battle that comes following those prophetic words. People give up waiting for their prophetic words to come. The battle begins when the declaration, whether prophetic or not, has been spoken.

When we are in a spiritual battle and need to

pray, crying out to God with prayers in our mind somehow doesn't seem quite strong enough. How can we truly express in our mind the desperation we are in for God to answer our prayer? Think about when we need to get our point across to a person or really need their help. Can a silent conversation convey our point? Of course not! We need to verbally communicate with that person. As Christians, we need to transition our prayers from our minds to our mouths in audible communication to the Lord.

What seems more effective in your prayer time? Thinking: "God help me. You know my situation. You know I need Your intervention." Or speaking out loud, "God, help me! God, I am desperate for You to show me the strategy to get this spiritual warfare to cease. Jesus, intervene for me! Give me divine strategies. Heavenly Father, I call out to You. Save me!"

I believe that sometimes we can't get our prayers answered because we think we are praying in our spirit when we are truly thinking about our situation in our mind, pondering it instead of praying about it. I believe that is why it is good to decree and declare our prayers out loud—so we get our mind busy and don't think about it. We

take action and pray about it instead.

I believe that is what David has modeled in the Bible for us, to verbally communicate with God. When I look at David and the distresses he must have been under, I don't think a silent conversation would have cut it. What about Jesus when He prayed so hard in the garden that He sweat blood? Do you really think praying in His mind, connecting only in spirit, would have gotten the job done? Absolutely not! He was in

anguish, pleading with His Father. That kind of prayer could have only been done verbally, out loud, spoken out, and I'm sure there must have been a raised voice in there somewhere. Do you think He said in a mousy way, “Father, take this cup from Me?” or do you think He cried out with anguish, stress, grief, confidence and desperation, “Father! Take this cup from Me!”

When we study about David in the Book of 2 Samuel, we discover many verbal action words referring to His prayer life, words such as “spoke,”

“call upon,” “cried out,” “cry” and “said.” These are all action words, words he had to speak. To speak, you need to open your mouth, move your lips and tongue, and activate your vocal cords and voice box. These are actions we have to take, like David, and when we exercise all of these communication skills, they have power and obtain great results.

What I love about 2 Samuel 22 is how God responded to David’s plea in distress. I think many times when we pray in our mind, we are thinking about our problems and getting stuck in a direction that is unfruitful and unprofitable. We can’t effectively convey to God what is in our heart. But when David cried out to God, He responded powerfully!

Right at the beginning of 2 Samuel 22, we discover the words “spoke,” “said” and “call upon”?

Now on the day the Lord delivered him from the hand of all of his enemies and from the hand of Saul, David spoke to the Lord the words of this song. He said: The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; the God of my strength, in whom I will trust; my shield and the horn of my salvation, my fortress and my sanctuary; my Savior, You save me from violence. I call upon the Lord, who is praiseworthy, and I am saved from

my enemies (2 Sam. 22:1-4).

David spoke to the Lord. He didn't think or communicate in his thoughts. He spoke.

Furthermore, in the day of deliverance, he verbally declared out loud who the Lord is: his rock, fortress and deliverer. He declared Him as the God of his strength and declared his trust for Him. David continued to praise the Lord with his words. He declared God as a stronghold, refuge and Savior. He proceeded to acknowledge that the Lord saves him from violence.

I believe some of our situations would change if we declared out loud who God is or should be to us instead of us thinking and pondering in our minds what is not happening. When we declare out who God is, we are taking our focus off of our problems and the victim mentality that could be attacking us and putting it on who God is and the victory we have in Him. It can take us from sulking to rejoicing in a minute.

David declared out the Lord as a refuge, a place of rest and retreat. Speaking these words will bring us life. It will bring us to a place of rest and retreat, knowing God protects us, since He is our shield. He is our safety, our place of solace. As we speak out who the Lord is, it comes back into our

ears, into our soul and into our spirit man and builds us up. As we hear those words, we start to believe them, and they become part of us as we live them out.

David continued to say that he would call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised (v. 4). “I will call upon” are action words. He is stating that when he calls upon the Lord, he will be saved. He is doing his part, so God can respond. David got up and called upon God. And God responded by saving David, which is preserving him, helping him, rescuing him, defending him and delivering him.

We could all use God to save us in a particular situation, but first we need to do our part as David did and call upon the Lord verbally, out loud. We need not just to think it but do it. Like the Nike slogan, just do it.

Praying in Tongues Releases Your Prophetic Words

I remember when I first started to pray in tongues. I had longed for that gift of prayer. One day, as I received the baptism of the Holy Spirit, my prayer language instantly manifested, as in Acts 2:4: “And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to speak.”

I have heard recently from the Lord to make it a priority and primary focus to be praying in tongues. I was even speaking with some friends who are hearing the same thing from the Lord right now. There is an urgency to pray in tongues and release our heavenly prayer language.

Why is it important to pray in tongues? What are the benefits? The Lord is showing me in this season that as we pray in tongues, our destiny will come forth.

Praying in tongues releases our prophetic destiny. We have an entire prayer language stocked up inside of us, waiting to be prayed out and released. When we pray in the Spirit, we are releasing the perfect will of the Father. Our flesh isn't involved in what we are praying. We are connecting our spirit to His Spirit to release the manifestation of the kingdom for our lives.

Often we don't know how to pray effectively and purely for what we need to happen. By praying in tongues or, as some call it, praying in the Spirit, we are yielding our control, will and fleshly tendencies to Him. We are submitting to the very will of God for our lives. We have been given our own will and we can make our own decisions, but it is more beneficial to live a life of submission to the will of the Father.

When you are praying in tongues, take the insights the Holy Spirit reveals to you in those moments to then transition your prayer time to audible praying through declarative prayer. We are not meant to just pray in tongues but to have a balance between praying in the Spirit and praying in our native language.

It is in the times of praying in tongues we can shut our mind down with our agendas and

analytical thoughts and allow the Spirit of the Lord to speak to us about what should be prayed and how. It is us co-laboring with the Holy Spirit that will make our prayer time useful and effective (Rom. 8:26).

I've been feeling in the spiritual realm that we are in a season of releasing our destinies. I have been conversing with people around the world

and numerous believers are feeling unctioed in their spirit to be praying in tongues. There is a sense of urgency and the Holy Spirit is instructing people to increase in their prayer language, to be spending more time praying in the Spirit. The Lord has been revealing to me that by praying in the Spirit, our destinies will release.

However, you can't pray in the Spirit without the Holy Spirit's fullness on the inside of you. If you are one of the many Christians desiring to pray in the Spirit, but your prayer language hasn't come forth, I encourage you to stop right now

and stretch out your hands. Speak out audibly and invite the Holy Spirit to come upon you.

I teach more about this in my book, *Baptism of Fire and Power: Gifts and Language of the Holy Spirit*. God is not a legalist. There aren't right or wrong words to speak out. However, you could speak out something similar to these phrases:

- Holy Spirit, come upon me. I invite You to fill me till I'm overflowing with the Spirit of the Lord.
- Jesus, I desire to be baptized in the Holy Spirit. I receive the Holy Spirit right now.
- I receive You, Holy Spirit; come upon me in Your fullness with the evidence of speaking in tongues.

Expect Holy Spirit to show up and fill you, and then start praying. If you don't feel your heavenly language coming up and forth, I suggest beginning by praying out loud in your native language. Praying out loud gets your lips moving, voice box activated and tongue moving. As you begin to pray in your native language out loud, your prayer language will eventually manifest.

Remember the verse from above, "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit enabled them

to speak” (Acts 2:4). It says they were filled, which means you too can be filled, and that they spoke as the Spirit enabled them. The Spirit will enable you, but sometimes that takes patience, time and belief on our part.

Pray audibly, focus on the Lord and allow your prayer language to come forth.

I want to encourage you to receive and release your prayer language. I am passionate about helping people release their prophetic destinies. I believe the more people walk in their full potential, the more people will be out there changing the world for Christ.

I need you to walk in your prophetic destiny because it is going to take a mass army to change and transform the world. People need Jesus and when you release your destiny, you can assist me in reaching the world for Jesus! Arise! Get in your prayer closet and release your destiny by praying in tongues.
